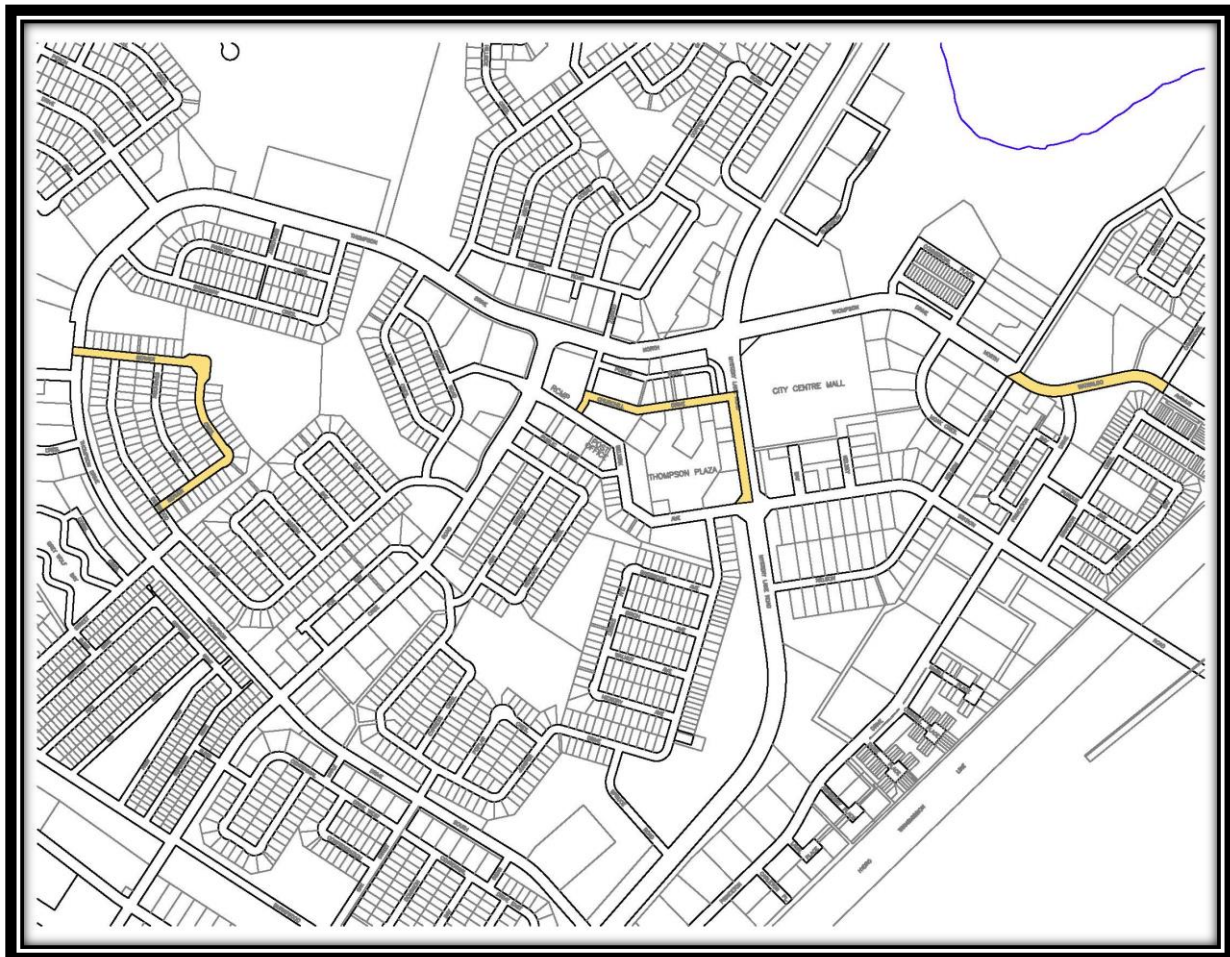
## Water & Sewer main Renewal 2017

**Expected Start Date: June 15, 2017**  
**Expected Completion Date: Sept 15, 2017**

The City of Thompson will be renewing water mains along Churchill Drive, Mystery Lake Road, and Waterloo Avenue. The City will also be renewing sewer and water mains, including services along Beaver Crescent. The goal is to improve the water distribution system and drinking water quality and replace the old infrastructure of Sanitary in Beaver Crescent which is ending up its life. This project is part of the 2017 Council Approved Capital Works Program.

Further notices will be given prior to construction with a more accurate start date and other information regarding the work. Your co-operation and patience during the construction period is crucial and appreciated.

## Project Details

This project involves:

- Replacing water mains along the roadway at all the above mentioned streets.
- Replacing sewer mains along the roadway in the Beaver Subdivision.
- Replacing the private water and sewer services up to the property line; and
- Restoring areas disturbed during construction.

Some people may have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home/building that are within the City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents/businesses are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

**Water disruptions during renewal:** Residents and commercial users will experience water disruptions in their area during the renewal. Further details regarding shut-off schedules will be provided to residents and businesses as construction begins. Residents and other establishments should shut off their boilers, coolers and other electric appliances that require water for operation to avoid any damage. The City will not be responsible for any damages due to appliances or equipment operating without water. Renewals may take longer than expected due to unknown subterranean conditions, so there might be situations when a shutdown will be longer than expected.

## Disruptions during Construction

In order to complete the necessary renewal work in a safe manner, it will be necessary to reduce traffic lanes and restrict parking. Access to driveways will be interrupted from time to time during construction. Local access and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times.

If you are considering replacing the privately-owned section of your service line, it is recommended that you obtain at least three quotes from licensed contractors before deciding which company to hire. Alternatively, owners may contact the same contractor retained by the City to obtain an estimate for replacing the private portion of the water service at the same time as the public portion. PLEASE NOTE: Any contract entered for privately-owned section of service is the home owner and the contractor, and the City of Thompson will not be responsible for any kind of damages to the property due to construction or replacement.
