Construction of Waste Water Treatment Plant

Expected Start Date: June 1st, 2017

Expected Completion Date: March 31st, 2019

The City of Thompson will be constructing the new Wastewater Treatment Plant. The goal is to treat municipal waste water to meet the provincial standards and discharge. This is a two year project. The project will include installing the new sanitary main from the Cree Lift station to the Waste Water Treatment Plant, and building a new lift station at Cree.

Further notices will be given during construction as there will be obstructions. Your cooperation and patience during the construction period is crucial and appreciated.

Project Details

This project involves:

- Constructing the new Waste Water Treatment Plant.
- Installing a new main sewer from Cree road lift station to the new WWTP along Princeton Drive.
- Restoring areas disturbed during construction.

Some people may have planted landscaping, fences, irrigation systems or other physical features in front of their home/building which are within City property limits. These may be in the way of the construction. In such cases, residents/businesses are advised to remove these items prior to the beginning of construction in order to avoid unnecessary damage. The City will not be responsible for damage to any privately owned items installed on the City's property.

Heavy Traffic: There will be heavy equipment and truck movement during the project which will cause the disruptions to residents. All the resident should drive slowly where the construction is happening.

Disruptions during Construction

In order to complete the necessary renewal work in a safe manner, it will be necessary to reduce traffic lanes and restrict parking. Access to driveways will be interrupted from time to time during construction. Local access and emergency traffic will be maintained at all times.

If you are considering replacing the privately-owned section of your service line, it is recommended that you obtain at least three quotes from licensed contractors before deciding which company to hire. Alternatively, owners may contact the same contractor retained by the City to obtain an estimate for replacing the private portion of the water service at the same time as the public portion.

PLEASE NOTE: Any contract entered for privately owned section of service will be between the home owner and the contractor, and the City of Thompson will not be responsible for any kind of damages to the property due to construction or replacement.
