
2017 CAPITAL CONSTRUCTION SEASON BEGINS

FOR IMMEDIATE RELEASE

THOMPSON, June 23, 2017 – Capital projects for the 2017 season have begun for the summer. This will result in several changes to motorized and pedestrian traffic throughout the city. Below is a list of capital projects being completed this season, and the potential impacts that the projects may create.

- **Water Main Renewal – Beaver Crescent area**
- **Multi-use Pathway – Princeton Drive (beginning at Mystery Lake Road)**
- **Sidewalk Renewal – Thompson Drive North (Beginning at Quartz, ending at Mystery Lake Road)**
- **Road Reconstruction – Selkirk Avenue (beginning at Public Lane, ending at Mystery Lake Road)**
- **Wastewater Treatment Plant – Eastwood Area, Cree Road**

For all projects, traffic and parking will be reduced in different areas throughout construction in order to ensure construction is completed safely. However, local and emergency access will be maintained at all times. The contractor is obligated to notify residents and businesses of any temporary driveway closures.

For all projects, there will be an increase in heavy equipment moving within the city as construction progresses. Residents are advised to exercise extreme caution around this equipment, including wide-turning semi's that may need to cross lanes in order to turn.

Selkirk Avenue will be closed in sections throughout construction in order to minimize interruptions to local access. At times, traffic will be detoured down Juniper Drive and Public Lane during various stages of construction. Local residents and businesses will be notified of any temporary driveway closures.
